PARK DIRECTIONS

PEPSI DOG PARK

From Asheville: Take I-40 and then take Exit 27 (no turns). Follow highway 23/74 West to Exit 102. Take Exit 102, turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go under bridge to 2nd red light. At light, turn left on Howell Mill Rd. (next to Rite Aid). Go ½ mile and turn right on Vance Street. Stay straight and turn right just before railroad tracks. Park at horse arena. Dog park is located in the chain link fence.

From Sylva: Follow 23/74 East to exit 102A. Turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go to 2nd red light. Turn left on Howell Mill Rd. (next to Rite Aid). Go ½ mile and turn right on Vance Street. Stay straight and turn right just before railroad tracks. Park at horse arena. Dog park is located in the chain link fence.

HAZELWOOD PARK

Dutch Fisher Park (beside Richland Creek) consists of a ball field, picnic shelter and playground. The park also has public restrooms. From Asheville: Take I-40 and take exit 27. Follow Highway 23/74 West to Exit 100/ Hazelwood Avenue. Take a left at stop sign. Go through traffic light to stop sign. Take a left then a quick left on Westwood Circle. Stay straight on Westwood Circle to park.

From Sylva: Follow 23/74 East to Exit 100/Hazelwood Avenue. Take a right at stop sign. Stay straight then take a left on Westwood Circle. Stay straight on Westwood Circle to park.

Park contains one softball field, picnic shelter, and restrooms

EAST STREET PARK

East Street is a passive neighborhood park with a picnic shelter. From Asheville: Take I-40 and take exit 27. Follow Highway 23/74 West. Take exit 102 and turn right on to Russ Avenue (276 South). Go through five traffic lights. Stay in the left lane. Take a left at the sixth traffic light. Take a right on to Howell Street. Stay straight. Park is on the right.

From Sylva: Follow 23/74 East to Exit 102A. Turn right on to Russ Avenue (276 South). Go through five traffic lights. Stay in the left lane. Take a left at the sixth traffic light. Take a right on to Howell Street. Stay straight. Park is on the right.

OLD ARMORY RECREATION CENTER

From Asheville: Take I-40 and then take Exit 27 (no turns). Follow highway 23/74 West to Exit 102. Take Exit 102, turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go under bridge to 2nd red light. At light, turn right on Howell Mill Rd. Cross railroad tracks. Turn left on to Boundary Street. See Old Armory Recreation Center on the right.

RECREATION PARK

Marshall Street, consists of a multi-use trail, six tennis courts, two softball fields, two outdoor basketball courts, two covered shelters. The park has picnic tables and public restrooms. From Asheville: Take I-40 and then take Exit 27 (no turns). Follow highway 23/74 West to Exit 102. Take Exit 102, turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go under bridge to 2nd red light. At light, turn left on Howell Mill Rd. (next to Rite Aid). Go ½ mile and turn right on Vance St. Follow Vance Street until the end and turn right. Take an immediate right on Marshall Street. See park on right.

From Sylva: Follow 23/74 East to exit 102A. Turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go to 2nd red light. Turn left on Howell Mill Rd. (next to Rite Aid). Go ½ mile and turn right on Vance St. Turn left just after passing softball field on the left. Follow Vance Street until the end and turn right. Take an immediate right on Marshall Street. See park on right.

VANCE STREET PARK & DISC GOLF

A 64,000 square foot multi-purpose recreation center, indoor pool and youth water play park. Located on 20 acres with a multi-use trail, a handicapped accessible fishing pier on a state supported trout stream, softball field, sand pit volleyball court, quarter mile paved running track, two soccer fields and a picnic shelter. Restrooms are located there as well. From Asheville: Take I-40 and then take Exit 27 (no turns). Follow highway 23/74 West to Exit 102. Take Exit 102, turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go under bridge to 2nd red light. At light, turn left on Howell Mill Rd. (next to Rite Aid). Go ½ mile and turn right on Vance St. Turn left just after passing softball field on the left.

From Sylva: Follow 23/74 East to exit 102A. Turn right on Russ Ave. (276 South). Go to 2nd

SULFUR SPRINGS PARK

This park is a passive landmark for the sulphur water which was thought to have medicinal qualities. From Asheville: Take I-40 and take exit 27. Follow Highway 23/74 West to Exit 100 / Hazelwood Avenue. Take a left at stop sign. Go to traffic light and take a left on to Sulfur Springs Road. Take a left on to Sloans Drive then right on to Timothy Lane. Park is on the left.

From Sylva: Follow 23/74 East to Exit 100/Hazelwood Avenue. Take a right at stop sign. Take a left on to Sulfur Springs Road. Go through traffic light. Take a left on to Sloan Drive. Take a right on to Timothy Lane. Park is on the left.

WAYNESVILLE SKATE PARK

From Asheville, NC Take I-40 West and take Exit 27 Follow Highway 23/74 West to Exit 102 and turn right on to Russ Avenue (276 South) Go under bridge to second red light and at light turn left on to Howell Mill Road Go 1/2 mile and turn right on to Vance Street and see the Center on the left Keep going down Vance Street - see Waynesville Skate Park on right

From Sylva, NC Follow 23/74 East to Exit 102A Turn right on to Russ Avenue (276 South) and go to second red light Turn left on to Howell Mill Road and go 1/2 mile and turn right on Vance Street See the Center on the left Keep going down Vance Street - see Waynesville Skate Park on right

COMMEMORATIVE TREE PLANTING

Trees range in price from \$100 to \$300 each.

Waynesville Disc Golf Course

Welcome to the Waynesville Disc Golf Course located at Vance Street Park! We hope you enjoy our beautiful course and we encourage fun, exciting and safe play. Disc golfers should always play by the rules set forth by the Professional Disc Golf Association, which can be reached at the website pdga.com. Disc golfers should always be courteous to fellow park users and should always yield to pedestrians including walkers, joggers, bike riders, cars and anyone who might be in the flight path of a flying disc. Disc golfers assume all responsibility for their actions and play. The Waynesville Parks and Recreation Department assumes no liability for bad behavior and irresponsible play by disc golfers and reserves the right to decline access to the park if players act in such a way.



Operating Hours: Dawn to Dusk Cost: FREE

RULES AND REGULATIONS

General: Disc golf is played like golf but instead you use a flying disc. One point is counted each time the disc is thrown and when a penalty is incurred. The object is to acquire the lowest score.

Tee Throws: Tee throws must be completed within or behind the designated tee area. Do not throw until the players in front of you are out of range. Lie: The spot where the previous throw has landed. You should mark with a mini disc or turn over the thrown disc directly towards the hole or dog leg.

Throwing Order: After teeing off, the player whose disc is the farthest from the hole always throws first. The player with the least amount of throws on the previous hole is the first to tee off on the next hole.

Dog Leg: A dog leg is one or more designated trees or poles in the fairway that must be passed as indicated by arrows. Until the dog leg is passed, the closest foot to the dog leg must be on the lie when the disc is released.

Completion of Hole: A disc that comes to rest in the disc pole hole basket or chains constituted successful completion of that hole.

Unplayable Lie: Any disc that comes to rest above the ground is considered an unplayable lie. The disc must be thrown from the lie on the ground directly underneath the unplayable lie. Relocate to avoid damage to the vegetation.


Out of Bounds: If out of bounds is visible between the disc and out of bounds line. A throw that lands out of bounds must be played from a point 3 feet in bounds from where the disc went out of bounds. Permanent water hazards and public roads are always out of bounds.

Course Courtesy: Please pick up trash and help new players play by the rules.

Waynesville Skate Park

Rules:

NOTICE TO ALL SKATERS:

This is an UNSUPERVISED skate park. Skating is permitted during park hours from DAWN till DUSK.

Any use of this facility is at your own risk. Use of this facility may result in serious injury.

IN CASE OF SERIOUS INJURY

- DO NOT MOVE THE INJURED PERSON.
- ALL SKATING SHALL CEASE IMMEDIATELY.
- DIAL 911 – YOU ARE LOCATED AT 285 VANCE STREET, WAYNESVILLE.

The following rules and regulations have been established for the use of skate park participants in order to ensure everyone's safety.

PLEASE OBEY THE FOLLOWING RULES:

- This is an unsupervised skatepark and its use is free of charge.
- Avoid skating when skate park surfaces are wet or icy.
- No motorized equipment is allowed in the skatepark.
- Every person riding a skateboard or skating in the facility must wear a helmet, elbow pads and knee pads. Any person failing to do so is subject to citation.
- Drugs, alcohol, glass containers, tobacco products, profanity, fighting, horseplay and destroying or defacing public property are prohibited. Vandalism, including graffiti, stickers and tagging are illegal. If this occurs, it may require the park to be closed temporarily. Violators will be prosecuted.
- Food and beverages are not allowed on the skate area.
- No one under the age of 8 is allowed without adult supervision.
- No spectators are allowed in the skate area.
- The Town of Waynesville reserves the right to revoke the use of the skate park by individuals who violate the rules and regulations of the skate park.
- Events, lessons and other organized activities require written permission from the Town of Waynesville.
- No other items, such as benches, tables, portable ramps or equipment, may be used in the skate park.
- Under North Carolina law, no governmental entity or public employee who has complied with G.S. 99E-23 shall be liable to any person who voluntarily participates in hazardous recreation activities for any damage or injury to property or persons that arise out of a person's participation in the activity and that takes place in an area designated for the activity.
- Make no modifications to the skating surface.

The Waynesville Parks & Recreation Department has one dog park for both large & small dogs. The park has benches but does not have water or restrooms.

The following rules are for your safety and the safety of the dogs. Please abide by all posted rules

- Be considerate of neighbors and park visitors and keep noise at a low level.
- All dogs must be leashed outside of the fenced dog park.
- Owners are solely responsible for injuries or damage caused by their dogs.
- Owners are responsible for picking up and disposing of any of their dog's feces in and out of the park area.
- People without dogs and especially children are not allowed in the dog park.
- Children under 12 should be closely supervised while in the dog park and it is strongly urged that young children not be brought to the dog park at all for their own health and safety.
- No dogs are to be left for any amount of time in the dog park without owner supervision.
- No other animals are allowed in the dog park at any time.
- Aggressive dogs or female dogs in heat are not permitted in the dog park and any dog(s) displaying violent/aggressive behavior should be immediately removed from the dog park.
- All dogs must be up-to-date on all shots and have collar and tags on the animal.
- No strollers, carriages, bicycles, children's toys, food or treats allowed in the dog park.

- Food will be allowed ONLY in the concession vending area. No glass containers allowed.
- Failure to adhere to these rules will result in ejection or suspension from the premises. Suspension means you lose the privilege of using the Old Armory Recreation Center facilities. NO financial reimbursement will be given due to suspension.



2015 Park Rules & Guidelines

THE TOWN OF WAYNESVILLE IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST OR STOLEN ARTICLES.

- Park users must be aware that participation in any physical activity or program could have inherent and unforeseen risks that may cause injury, harm or death.
- Anyone taking part in a program or activity sponsored by the Waynesville Parks and Recreation Department must assume the risks associated with such participation and be responsible for taking proper precautions.
- No one under the age of 18 years may smoke on Waynesville Parks and Recreation Department property. NO alcoholic beverages, drugs, fire arms or other weapons, or gambling are allowed on Waynesville Parks and Recreation Department property.
- Vandalism, defacing of property, loitering or use of profanity will not be tolerated. Restitution will be required for any misuse.
- Any expression of physical or verbal abuse, or acts of intimidation, harassment, or other threatening behavior directed towards any staff member or park user will result in suspension and/or legal action.
- Using the Waynesville Parks and Recreation Department property for personal gain or profit is prohibited unless given permission by the Department.
- All animals outside of the Pepsi Dog Park must be on a leash.
- Animal owners must clean up after their animal.
- Failure to adhere to these rules will result in ejection or suspension from the park.
